Agility Association of Canada General Agreement

The person who signs this agreement represents that he/she is authorized to enter into this agreement.

I/We, the undersigned, certify I/we are the actual owners of the dog, or that I/we are the duly authorized agent(s) of the actual owner of the dog entered hereon. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I/we have read, understand and will abide by the Official Rules and Regulations of the Agility Association of Canada Inc. in effect at the time of this entry, and by any additional rules and regulations appearing in the Agility Trial Schedule for this event. I/we certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. This entry is submitted for acceptance on the foregoing representation and General Agreement/Disclaimer. I/we agree to conduct myself (ourselves) in accordance with such Official Rules and Regulations (including all provisions applying to discipline) and to abide by any decisions made in accordance with them.

I/We, the undersigned, agree that the host club has the right to refuse my entry for causes which the organizing committee shall deem to be sufficient.

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and the holding of the event and the opportunity to have the dog participate, or be judged:

I/We acknowledge all hazards presented by the event and the event premises, including but not limited to trial rings, parking areas, walking trails and surrounding area and the presence of unfamiliar animals and people.

I/We agree to hold the organizing committee, the organization which it represents including its members, officers, and directors, the Agility Association of Canada, sponsors of the event, owner of the premises upon which the event is being held and their employees, harmless from any claims for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any persons or thing by the act of this dog while in or upon the event premises or grounds or near entrances thereto, and I/We personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim. I/We further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from claims of this dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise from any damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, death or otherwise be caused or alleged to be caused by negligence of the parties aforementioned, or by negligence of any person, or any cause or causes.

CLASS DESCRIPTION

AAC Starters Class: The Starters class shall be for dogs not having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title. A dog must achieve 3 clear rounds under 2 different judges to be awarded the ADC title.

AAC Advanced Class: The advanced class shall be for dogs that having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title, but that have not earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC) title. A dog must achieve 3 clear rounds under 2 different judges to be awarded the AADC title.

AAC Masters Class: The Masters class shall be for dogs having earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC) title. To be awarded the Master Agility Dog of Canada (MADC) title by the AAC, a dog must achieve 3 clear rounds under 2 different judges.

AAC Veterans Class: These classes shall be for dogs seven years of age or older that are currently competing in any Standard Agility Class and for dogs five years of age or older who have competed in the Specials Agility Class for a minimum of one calendar year.

AAC Special Classes: These classes are open to all dogs but are intended for dogs that are of a size or stature that limits their jumping ability. A dog may no longer compete in standard titling classes after being entered at an official trial in any Special class except that they may move to Veterans.

Steeplechase: is a class offered at only one level, but open to all dogs, (starters/advanced and masters all compete together. It is a fast, moving course consisting of jumps, tire, tunnels, weave poles and A-frame. Ten (10) qualifying runs earns a **Masters Steeplechase Dog of Canada Title**

GAMES: Classes are now offered and **mandatory at 3 levels:** Starters, Advance and Masters. Progression from one level to the next is as follows:

- Movement into Advanced Games from Starters Games requires one qualifying score in the Starter game to move to that Advanced game. (example: 1 Starters Snooker qualifying score, moves you to Advanced Snooker)
- 1 qualifying score in each of the 4 Starter Games earns a **Starter Games Title**
- Movement into Masters Games from Advanced Games requires 2 qualifying scores under 2 different judges in the Advance Game to move to that Masters Game (example: 2 Advanced Snooker qualifying scores, under 2 different judges, moves you to Masters Snooker)
- 2 qualifying score in each of the 4 Advanced games earns an **Advanced Games Title**

GENERAL NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS:

This trial is sanctioned by the Agility Association of Canada, with Campaign Dog Academy (CDA) as the host club. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of AAC rules & regulation including but not limited to the following:

- This event is held under AAC rules & regulations and is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, purebred or mixed breed, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs showing signs of aggression.
- All dogs must have an official AAC identification card, which must be produced at registration. Any dog without a card, with a card pending, under two years of age, or without two official measurements on their ID card must be measured before competing. A dog over 23" at the withers can have a signed ID card before two years of age.
- Obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the rules and regulations of the AAC and shall conform to AAC specifications. There will not be an official familiarization of equipment. However, warm up jumps will be provided.
- No leads, collars, food, toys or any other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behaviour of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour, may be asked to leave the show grounds and NO REFUND of fees paid will be made.
- Exhibitors MUST keep crate and exercise areas clean. Please pick up after yourselves, your guests and your dogs.
- The host club reserves the right to refuse any entry. There will be no refunds, cancellations or changes after the closing date, except for move-ups as per AAC regulations, bitches that come into season or dogs that have been injured provided that the trial secretary is notified at least one week prior to the trial date and a certificate from a veterinarian is provided.
- Any dog earning a title after the closing date of this trial is eligible to move up to the next level as long as the exhibitor notifies the Secretary at least one week prior to the trial. A dog earning a title on the Saturday of this trial is allowed to move up on Sunday, as long as the secretary is notified before the completion of the trial on Saturday.

Please note: Abuse in any form, of the volunteers, competitors or the judge will not be tolerated. Anyone disrupting the trial due to poor sportsmanship or abusive behaviour, will be dismissed from the trial, no fees will be refunded, and any legs earned to that point will be null.
